and properties assigned to the 107th Fighter Interceptor Group. Additional activities which fall under the flight's responsibility are: Administration and Reports, Pass and Registration,

Personnel/Information Security, and Base Combat Arms Training.

The 107th Security Police Flight has seen many changes in the past 20 years. In the late 60's, the flight consisted of a 27 man section. In the early 70's, with the units receipt of the Air Defense Mission, the flight grew to 110 men. With the loss of the Air Guards nuclear capability role in 1975, the flight was reduced to 82 men. In July of 1988 the 107th FIG's 4 man Combat Arms Section became part of the 107th Security Police Flight.

27 MAY thru 11 JUNE 1977, the 107th Security Police Flight was selected by National Guard Bureau to be the first ANG Security Police Unit to attend Anti-Terrorist and Tactics School at Camp Bullis, Texas. 90 other ANG Security Police Flights strived for the high standard established by the 107th Security Police Flight.

The Security Police Flight had a security programs test (SPT) on 16-19 August by NORAD/ADCOM personnel, the overall rating was excellent.
