OPERATIONS

In 1950, the 110th Weather Station was reorganized to become an Air National Guard weather station. The 110th WF was formed 20 April 1963, and assigned the primary mission of providing weather support to the 131st Tactical Fighter Wing. It retained this mission until 1979 when it was converted to a tactical weather flight and tasked to provide weather support to the 155th Separate Armored Brigade, Mississippi Army National Guard. The change in mission required 110 WF members to not only be proficient in weather observing and forecasting skills, but also the soldier skills required of all army personnel. The primary tasks

of the unit include gathering meteorological information under field conditions and provide overall tactical observing and forecasting services to its assigned organization. As of December 1992, the 110th Weather Flight has been assigned to provide weather services to the 244th Aviation Brigade, USARC, Chicago, Illinois.

On December 5, 1998, Maj. Mark Crosby replaced LtCol. Pamela Davis as the new 110th Weather Flight Commander.
