114th AERO SQUADRON— Commanded by 1st Lieut. Harry A. Bradford. The men composing this squadron were recruited at this field from Belleville, East St. Louis, and St. Louis. All soldiers who were unfit for overseas duty were transferred from other squadrons to the 114th, thus acquiring for itself the nickname of "Sick, Lame and Lazy Squadron." However, such was the determination and self-reliance of these recruits they soon outlived this undeserved sobriquet, developing into a most efficient organization. Was designated, in July as Squadron "A," and as such was transferred in

command of 2nd Lieut. Frank P. Albrook to Aviation General Supply Depot, Little Rock, Arkansas, early in December.
