

Also present during operation VOLANT OAK was the 118 CAMS. They had an outstanding in commission rate allowing for a 2.7 hour per day utilization rate per aircraft. The required rate was 2.0 hours.


The 118 CAMS was selected by NGB to be the first C-130 base to implement the new "Maintenance Management Information Control System" (MMICS). The upload started in late September 1979. Equipment arrived in October 1979 and NGB load team arrived in December 1979. Basic load was completed 20 Dec 79. Over 10,000 keypunch cards had to be punched to load aircraft records, training and all maintenance personnel data.

118 CAMS participated in Exercise Border Star with 42 Maintenance personnel and one aircraft. Personnel and aircraft departed 31 March 1981 and returned 8 April 1981.


The 118 CAMS performed their annual active duty training from 14-28 April 1984 at Rhein Main Air Force Base, Germany.






Who has the wrench? 118 Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron maintainers servicing a C-97 engine. (TN ANG photo)
