On a disc parted Azure and Vert, a bar keystoned Gules surmounted by two lightning flashes descending points to base Or and between in base a sword point to base Argent, hilt of the same, grip of the third, above in chief a fleur-de-lis Sable fimbriated of the fifth, all within a narrow border of the third. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "BAYOU BATTLEFIELD AIRMEN" in Red letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "122 AIR SUPPORT OPERATIONS SQ" in Red letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red keystoned line represents the joint firepower that connects Air Force operations to the earth. A sword borne on two lightning flashes signifies communications control for both state and federal missions. The black fleur-de-lis edged white symbolizes the unit's ability to rise above the challenge in battle.
