EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a longhorn skull affronté Argent, emitting from the top a wing to sinister Gris and a lightning flash to dexter Or, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "RIGID FLEXIBILITY" in Yellow

letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "136TH AIRLIFT CONTROL FLIGHT" in Blue letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The longhorn symbolizes the unit's dedication to the community. The lightning bolt symbolizes the core capabilities of command, control and communications. The wing symbolizes the commitment to the air mobility mission.
