Unit placed on the deferred list 2 July 1923 as a Deferred National Guard (DNG) unit, and replaced in the mobilization plan by the 56th Balloon Group (DNG). Redesignated as Headquarters, 136th Balloon Group in 1924. Withdrawn from the National Guard on 17 September 1927 and demobilized.
