The 145th Communications Flight (Support), NCANG, was designated and activated at Douglas Municipal, Charlotte, NC, effective 15 June 1966. Authorized strength: 2 officers and 27 airmen. Gaining Command: Air Force Communications Service (AFCS). The 145th Communications Flight was attached to the 145th Support Squadron, NCANG, for administrative and logistic support. The 145th Comm Flt was a new unit for the 145th Military Airlift Group, NCANG.

The 145th Communications Flight (Support), NCANG, was redesignated the 145th Information Systems Flight, NCANG, with no change in station or gaining command, effective 1 July 1985.

The 145th Information Systems Flight, NCANG, was redesignated the 145th Communications Flight, NCANG, with no change in station or gaining command, effective 8 December 1986.

The 145th Communications Flight, NCANG, was transferred to the Badin Air National Guard Station, Badin, NC, effective 1 June 1991.

The 145th Communications Flight, NCANG, Badin, North Carolina, was inactivated effective 2359 hours, 1 October 1993 and returned to the control of the National Guard Bureau.

The 145th Communications Flight, NCANG was again designated and activated at Charlotte, North Carolina, and assigned to the 145th Airlift Group, effective 0001 hours, 1 march 1994. Gaining Command: Air Combat Command . Authorized Strength: 1 officer and 41 airmen.
