145 USAF Dispensary: Provides medical support to mission squadron and allied units. Provides limited diagnostic and therapeutic services in the fields of general and aviation medicine; provides limited dental services.

The 145th USAF Dispensary could not be activated on 1 July 1957 because it did not have a medical officer assigned. The unit was activated and received Federal Recognition effective 21 September 1957

145th USAF Dispensary 10 34 Commander: 1 Lt (later Capt) Robert P. Crouch, MC

Units of the 145th Fighter Group (AD) (with exception of the 145th USAF Dispensary) were activated, and received Federal Recognition, effective 0001 hours, 1 July 1957.

The following listed units, North Carolina Air National Guard, were inactivated at Douglas Municipal Airport, Charlotte, NC effective 14 May 1971 and returned to the control of the National Guard Bureau: 145th USAF Dispensary--The following listed units, North Carolina Air National Guard, were designated and activated at Douglas Municipal Airport, Charlotte, NC effective 0001 hours, 15 May 1971:m145th Tactical Dispensary

Redesignated as the 145th Tactical Clinic, effective 8 April 1973, without any other changes.

Following subordinate units of the 145th Airlift Group, NCANG, were redesignated as shown below, with no change in station, strength or gaining command (Air Combat Command), effective 1 March 1994.
