## EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a mountain range fesswise throughout Grebe, snowcapped Argent, in fesspoint a stylized America bald eagle stooping Sable, head and tail feathers of the third, eyed, armed and membered Or, detailed of the fourth, grasping two branches of sage Proper stalked and leaved Vert, all within a narrow bordure of the fifth. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "HIGH ROLLERS" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "152D OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Yellow letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The gray snow-capped mountains denote the majesty, humility and retrospection of the employment of air power. The eagle with sage represents the scholarly wisdom, constancy and humility indicative of victorious air operations. The motto, "HIGH ROLLERS," refers to the unit's risk taking mentality and adventurous code.
