The 166th Maintenance Group is responsible for the maintenance of eight C-130s. These cargo aircraft provide tactical airlift and airdrop missions all over the world in support of in-place and deployed combat operations. Peacetime activities include humanitarian missions, training and providing well maintained, highly mission capable aircraft for tasking. The 166 MXG is comprised of the 166th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, the 166th Maintenance Operations Flight and the 166th Maintenance Squadron.
