EMBLEM

On a disc Ultramarine Blue, a bomb in bend Argent, overall the head of a feral boar issuant from sinister Gules, shaded Sable, armed of the second detailed Silver Gray and clutching a wrench of the like, in its jaws; all within a narrow Yellow border. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "HAWG COUNTRY" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed

"188TH MAINTENANCE SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The razorback hog is a symbol of the unit's home state. The bomb signifies munitions while the hog clutching the wrench in its jaws indicates the maintenance mission.
