### EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a skeleton key in chief Or with four lightning bolts emitting from it to base of the second; in base a demi-globe Silver Gray gridlined Argent, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "SCIENTIA POTENTIA EST" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Silver Gray

scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed “192D INTELLIGENCE SQ” in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The key represents military intelligence. The lightning bolts signify electromagnetic emissions. The globe symbolizes the earth, representing the global nature of the unit’s support operations. The unit’s motto, “SCIENTIA POTENTIA EST,” a quote attributed to Sir Francis Bacon, translates to “Knowledge is Power,” representing the Squadron’s mission of generating intelligence information to accomplish national objectives.
