EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a keystone Gules fimbriated Or, surmounted by an American bald eagle Proper volant, grasping in dexter claw two arcing lightning bolts Argent and in sinister claw a key of the same, emitting from sinister base of the keystone and contrailing to dexter, three stylized flight symbols of the fourth, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "SUPPORT AND SUCCEED" in Yellow letters.

Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "193D LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The American bald eagle is a United States symbol of freedom, and symbolizes strength, dedication, devotion to duty and excellence to the personnel the unit supports. The two lightning bolts in its right talon symbolize military strength and wartime readiness. The key signifies supply and security. The three flight symbols represent rapid response in all modes of transportation. The keystone alludes to the great State of Pennsylvania, and symbolizes the unit's dedication of service to its country
