March 1998—Members of the 235th Air Traffic Control Squadron (ATCS) deployed to Tazsar AB, Hungary for five months in support of Operation Joint Guard.<sup>24</sup> The 235th performed ATC duties in support of NATO peacekeeping efforts in Bosnia.

December 1999—The 235th Air Traffic Control Squadron deployed personnel to Saudi Arabia as a part of the Aerospace Expeditionary Force 3 (AEF 3) deployment.<sup>38</sup> The AEF was designed to provide a rapid deployment force to areas of crises. It links USAF, ANG and AFRC units from all over the world to perform missions and share rotations for a single operation.
