EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, two lightning flashes in chief chevronwise reverse Gules, surmounted by a palmetto tree and in dexter chief a crescent bendwise sinister Or, overall in base and eagle

stooping of the second, head and tail Sable, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "245TH ATCS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle symbolizes our great nation and the power of flight for freedom. The palmetto tree and crescent moon honor the State of South Carolina, the location of the unit. The lightning bolts denote the strength and speed of the electronics technology that powers our mission. The colors of the emblem symbolize the traits of honor, loyalty, courageousness and determination to succeed, possessed by unit members.
