EMBLEM

The 307 Logistics Readiness Squadron emblem consists of three distinctive elements, each symbolizing a unique aspect of the squadron. The emblem consists of a blue disc; over from the left area of the disc is an alligator in green; in the dexter area of the disc is a white key crossed by yellow lightning bolt. Attached to the Disc is a narrow scroll inscribed "307 Logistics Readiness Squadron" and "Aut Inveniam Viam Aut Faciam (Lead the Way or Find a Way)" in Yellow Letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue, green, white and yellow are the 307 LRS's colors. The blue disc represents "the sky", the primary theater of Air Force operations. The green alligator symbolizes the 307 LRS's resiliency and fierce and confident ability to accomplish the logistics mission. The white key symbolizes the security, safekeeping, and control of materiel in the old "Quartermaster Corps" tradition. The yellow lightning bolt symbolizes the integrating role of contingency operations and the capability to combine essential logistics elements into a coherent plan supporting the warfighter.
