On a disc per pale Celeste and Azure, four deltas with contrails, two arcing to dexter chief and two arcing to sinister chief Gules, surmounted by a dogwood blossom Or, above and arcing in chief seven mullets Argent; all within a narrow border of the fourth. Attached below the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "307TH OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Yellow letters. Significance. Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The split colored disc, indicative of the earth, portrays global capabilities, with light blue and Air Force blue respectively representing daytime and nighttime operations around the world. The red arrows symbolize aircraft and vapor trails, signifying each of the supported flying units. The arrows originate from behind the dogwood blossom, demonstrating the relentless support from the 307th Bomb Wing. Each of the seven white stars represents one of the 307 OSS support functions: Aircrew Flight Equipment, Intelligence, Range and Airspace, Operations, Combat Crew Communications, Aviation Resource Management, Survival Evasion Resistance and Escape.
