### EMBLEM

308th Missile Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a missile nose cone pointing upward per fess debased AF golden yellow and paly, black and white, a missile and missile trailer fesswise below a helicopter fesswise, both silhouetted black above the edge of a globe issuing from base, light blue, edged white, land areas of the western hemisphere, golden brown; the border charged with

18 white stars, nine on each side of the nose cone. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission which is to maintain, through technical skill and mobility, all complexes and missiles in a state of readiness to assure peace and security to the world. Against a background and border of the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow, a fence and globe indicate world security. A missile and trailer represent maintenance and transporting of the missile. The helicopter represents the mobility required of our maintenance personnel and the 18 stars symbolize the complexes where this unit will accomplish its mission. (Approved, 6 Jun 1963)
