Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921 as Headquarters, 308th Pursuit Group,, assigned to the 7th Attack Wing (Fifth Army), and allotted to the Sixth Corps Area. Initiated on 4 May 1922 with headquarters at Peoria, IL. Relocated on 2 June 1925 to Bloomington, IL. Inactivated 1 December 1929 at Bloomington by relief of personnel. Reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, 308th Transport Group on 1 October 1933, relieved from the Fifth Army, and assigned to the General Headquarters Reserve. Conducted summer training most years with units of the 1st Pursuit Group at Chanute Field, IL, 1923-29. Disbanded 31 May 1942.
