EMBLEM

Sable, an eagle's head erased Proper, between two piles reversed bendwise sinister Azure, encircled overall by seven mullets Argent, all within a diminished bordure of the first. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "314TH AEROMEDICAL-DENTAL SQ" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "SEMPER PARATUS" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The bald eagle reflects the unit's strength and vigilance in the performance of its mission. The ring of stars denotes the continuous twenty-four hour medical service provided by the Squadron. The flight symbols indicate the dual mission function of the unit.
