The 314th Supply Squadron greeted a new vehicle with enthusiasm in early July. A new R-11 aircraft refueling truck, the first delivered to the base, replaced the aging R-9 vehicles. The R-11's have a capacity of 6,000 gallons and can pump 600 gallons of fuel per minute. These trucks can also unload fuel from an aircraft at 175 gallons per minute.
