EMBLEM

On a disc tierce in pairle Silver Gray, Vert and Azure, a terrestrial globe Proper, supported by two hands appaumé Proper, charged with an aircraft palewise nose to chief of the second, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "READY IN RESERVE" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "315 OPERATIONS SUPPORT FLT" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The background colors signify land, sea and air operations. The two hands demonstrate the human care and sacrifice of the unit in performance of the mission. The aircraft symbolizes the first priority of the air mission.
