EMBLEM

On a blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border issuing from sinister base a portion of a green globe rimmed and grid lined yellow surmounted by two yellow arrows, one in back of the other, the topmost arrow arced, extending beyond the globe onto the blue background and showing a red reverse. Arced above the globe to dexter below a green arced olive branch a yellow arrow showing a red reverse. Attached above the disc a blank white scroll edged yellow. **SIGNIFICANCE:**

The overall design signifies worldwide strike capability of weapons which are maintained by this squadron and peace through deterrence. The large olive branch at top, covering entire design, symbolizes peace. Large arrow signifies air dropped and ground launched ballistic weapons. Smaller arrows signify the maneuverability and accuracy of smaller guided weapons. Portion of globe in foreground indicates the worldwide capabilities of these weapons. Colors: Green of olive branch and major part of globe symbolizes peace Air Force Golden Yellow of arrows and globe divisions, for the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel Ultramarine Blue AF; the sky, Red of underside of arrows, powerful and swift potential of weapons.
