## **OPERATIONS**

Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 29 July 1921 as the 323rd Balloon Company, assigned to the 46th Balloon Group (redesignated as the 546th Balloon Group on 20 February 1924), and allotted to the Sixth Corps Area. Initiated in August 1922 at Green Bay, WI. Inactivated by June 1929 at Green Bay by relief of personnel. Redesignated as the 323rd Balloon Squadron on 1 October 1933. Withdrawn from the Sixth Corps Area on 1 January 1938 and allotted to the Ninth Corps Area. Concurrently relieved from the 546th Balloon Group and assigned to the 66th Balloon Group. Los Angeles, CA, designated as headquarters on reorganization, but the unit was never organized at that location. Status: Disbanded on 31 May 1942.
