MISSION

The 341 Security Forces Squadron provides law enforcement services to the main base complex, ensuring Team Malmstrom remains a safe and law-abiding community for a base population of more than 10,000. They provide gate security, base mobile patrols, security for Protection Level 1 resources in the Weapons Storage Area, and military working dog teams providing explosive and narcotic detection. They provide information, personnel, and industrial security administration. They operate the pass and registration office, visitors center and run Montana's first enhanced 911 center, which streamlines community 911 needs. They also operate a confinement facility supporting four Air Force bases.



EMBLEM





341 Security Police Squadron emblem On an arrowhead within a narrow yellow border and divided into three parts by an inverted chevron throughout fimbriated yellow forming a light blue center charged with a white missile ascending, outlined and detailed blue emitting three white contrails, the missile between a sunburst on the dexter side and five stars on the sinister side all yellow. On a red dexter base a white silhouette of an Air Force sentry. On a blue sinister base a white silhouette of a Minuteman sentinel. Below a white scroll edged blue, showing a light blue reverse, and inscribed in blue capital letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. The background colors of red and blue allude to valor and vigilance. The missile depicts the security function of the unit. The sun and stars allude to the day and night operations. The Minuteman silhouette represents the spirit and determination of the squadron to safeguard the nation's peace, while the sentry is symbolic of the alertness and resourcefulness of the personnel. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, golden yellow and ultramarine blue.

341 Security Forces Squadron emblem; On a disc Azure, on an isosceles triangle bordered Or, one point up triparted Celeste, bearing a flight symbol rising palewise Argent above two lines enarched pilewise of the second, a chevron reversed in dexter enarched to sinister Gules, charged with a "sentry" figure silhouette contourné of the fourth and in sinister a chevron reversed enarched to dexter Blue, charged with a minuteman figure silhouette Argent, a point per chevron reversed Argent bearing four barrulets radiating from nombril point, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed 341 SECURITY FORCES SQUADRON in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "WE LEAD BY DEED" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The sentry indicates the unit's alertness and resourcefulness in meeting its objectives. The minuteman stands for the Squadron's spirit and determination to safeguard the nation's peace. The flight symbol refers to the unit's valor and vigilance. (Approved, 19 Apr 1965)
