EMBLEM

347th Supply Squadron Description On a disc, gules and azure, a pile in point reverse, argent. Overall, an eagle-facing dexter with wings elevated and displayed, standing on two lightning bolts, or all within a diminished border of the last. Above and below two scrolls of azure, the one above inscribed with the words Procuramus Subsidium in letters or motto. Significance The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. The American eagle symbolizes the unit's readiness to combat. The lightning bolts refer to the speed with which the organization is prepared to respond. The red stands for courage, and the blue and golden-yellow are the Air Force colors. Ultramarine blue depicts, depicting the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and yellow, the sun, and excellence of personnel in assigned tasks.
