Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 31 March 1924, assigned to the General Headquarters Reserve, and allotted to the Ninth Corps Area. Initiated on 22 October 1925 with headquarters at Seattle, WA. Boeing Field designated as mobilization training station. Inactivated by June 1929 at Seattle by relief of personnel. Reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, 349th Bombardment Group on 1 October 1933. Disbanded 31 May 1942.
