MISSION

The 351st Transportation Squadron is the focal point of all the military vehicle movement on the base and within the missile complex. These professional transporters manage four branches: Vehicle Operations, the hub of the vehicle movement; Vehicle Maintenance, which keeps the vehicles working; Traffic Management, which moves Air Force property and the valuable belongings of Air Force personnel; and Plans and Programs, which works with mobility and resource management.

The Vehicle Maintenance branch was also selected as the best in the Eighth Air Force in 1986. They maintain, repair, and recondition Whiteman's 650-vehicle fleet. This includes all general purpose vehicles and many specialized vehicles, all of them mission essential for missile operations.

The Traffic Management Branch is responsible for receiving, documenting, and preparing DOD-sponsored cargo and household goods for shipment by surface, air, and ocean-going vehicles. They also handle official and leisure travel arrangements for military people and their families. The Plans and Programs Branch is the smallest and the newest branch in the squadron. They provide overall continuity to the logistical programs in the squadron. The branch manages the mobility program and resources, manages the squadron security programs, administers the squadron budget, and coordinates the fielding of other base-level transportation systems.
