354th Operations Support Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, a chevron Or, debruised by a husky head erased Proper, above in chief the constellation of the Big Dipper and North Star Argent, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "354TH OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The husky symbolizes might, leadership and teamwork. The chevron represents a climb towards excellence. The stars are representative of the constellation of the Big Dipper, which contains the North Star and symbolizes team goals and focus for the future.
