EMBLEM



On a disc per fess wavy, red, and Air Force blue, a snarling wildcat's head affronte in natural colors, Air Force golden yellow, markings and details black, eyes green, nose and teeth white. Our emblem signifies our squadron's mission. The wildcat represents our squadron and the determination and aggressive spirit with which its personnel performs. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The ultramarine blue of the background and the golden yellow of the wildcat and scroll are the official Air Force colors and indicate that our squadron is an integral part of the USAF. The red indicates valor. (Approved, 12 Jun 1958)
