EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a nebuly Or, a stylized scorpion Spicebrown fimbriated Sable flanked by two scimitars of the fourth dexter side point to chief and sinister side point to base, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "386TH EOSS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air

Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The black scimitar represents the strength and might of combat air power in Southwest Asia. The elements together maintain visual continuity with the official emblems of the Squadron's parent organizations, the 386th Air Expeditionary Wing and the 386th Expeditionary Operations Group. The brown scorpion represents the desert and alludes to the Southwest Asia Theater of Operations where the unit was first activated. The scorpion symbolizes veracity, accuracy and precision, which are necessary tenets in every aspect of the EOSS mission.
