OPERATIONS

Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921 as the 410th Squadron (Attack), assigned to the 305th Attack Group (Fifth Army), and allotted to the Third Corps Area. Initiated on 30 December 1921 at Altoona, PA. Relocated by April 1923 to Richmond, VA. Redesignated as the 410th Attack Squadron on 25 January 1923. Inactivated on 23 July 1929 at Richmond by relief of personnel. Consolidated on 30 November 1936 with the 410th Aero Squadron (Construction) (a WWI unit organized in November 1917 at Vancouver Barracks, WA; redesignated as the 4th Spruce Squadron [Construction] in July 1918; demobilized in January 1919 at Vancouver Barracks; reconstituted on 30 November 1936).
