Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921 as the 411th Squadron (Observation), assigned to the 315th Observation Group (Fifth Army), and allotted to the Third Corps Area. Initiated in June 1922 at Ridgway, PA. Relocated by April 1923 to Norfolk, VA. Redesignated as the 411th Observation Squadron on 25 January 1923. Inactivated on 25 July 1929 at Norfolk by relief of personnel. Conducted summer training at Langley Field, VA. Demobilized on 1 October 1933.
