Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921 as the 413th Squadron (Headquarters), assigned to the Second Army and allotted to the Fifth Corps Area. Initiated in April 1922 at Boone, WV. Redesignated as the 413th Headquarters Squadron on 25 January 1923. Inactivated on 6 October 1928 at Boone by relief of personnel. Concurrently withdrawn from the Fifth Corps Area. Disbanded on 31 May 1942.
