## **EMBLEM**



On a disc Azure, a depiction of an aircraft runway Silver Gray properly marked by runway markings Or and Argent, all diminished and arraswise in bend sinister, overall a knight in trian aspect Sable, clothed of the fourth, holding at his side in his sinister hand a sword bendwise sinister and helmed of the second, the helmet plumed of the third, holding the top of a shield Gules with his extended dexter hand, the shield bordered Yellow and marked by Black rivets, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "PELLO APTO POENA UT COMPOSITUS" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "420TH CIVIL ENGINEER SQ" in Black letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The knight signifies the unyielding determination of Squadron personnel, their will to fight and their might to make it happen. The runway alludes to the unit's forward operating location and its ties to NATO. (Approved, 18 Jan 2006)
