EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a Greek temple of two columns Argent, emitting from base a cogwheel of five cogs center voided of the field Gules, superimposed by a pencil compass Or, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MAKE IT BETTER MAKE IT HAPPEN" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "422D CIVIL ENGINEER SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The gear and compass represent civil engineering. The temple is indicative of the unit's pursuit of excellence. (Approved, 22 Dec 2005)
