## **EMBLEM**

On a disc quarterly Argent and Celeste, a terrestrial globe Azure, land masses Vert, environed by a contrail emitting from North America to dexter terminating in a delta over the Atlantic ocean Or, all entoured by a chain Sable, all within a narrow bordure Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a Yellow border and inscribed "424 SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The chain symbolizes the management responsibilities of the unit in order to meet the supply needs of the customer. The globe represents the worldwide support provided by the unit for mission success. The flight symbol and contrail suggests the speed of which the components of acquisition, logistics, repair, storage, distribution, disposal, technical and engineering services are made available by the unit in order to execute the mission.
