EMBLEM



Azure gridlined as a globe throughout Sable, a key bendwise ward to base and dexter Or, surmounted by a sword bendwise sinister point to base Argent grip Gules, overall a chess knight Black fimbriated white; all within a diminished bordure Black. Attached above the disc a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border. Attached below the disc a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "COMMITTED TO EXCELLENCE" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary

theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence unit provides to the Air Force mission of Global Reach/Global Power. and sword symbolize the unit's ability to unlock the protagonists' secrets and provide todays warrior with intelligence in his efforts to defend against brute force. 426 Intelligence Squadron conducts information operations by providing tailored, multidisciplined intelligence products to U.S. and allied warfighters. Evaluates and disseminates information on foreign weapons and technology. Analyzes adversary weapons and tactics. Provides cryptologic support, communications/computer security services and aircrew electronic combat training.

The squadron falls under the 960th Cyberspace Operations Group at JBSA-Lackland, Texas, includes more than 60 Reservists tasked with protecting USAF's network infrastructure from cyber attack, according to a March 20 release. "We're growing in leaps [and] bounds from where we were last year. [We went] from two detachments to a squadron," said Col. Lloyd Terry, 960th CYOG commander. "We started out small and now just a year later, we have grown the unit to close to 60 and we're continuing to expand that growth." The ceremony took place March 8 at JBSA-Lackland. 2014
