EMBLEM

Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Ultramarine blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Air Force yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The three parts of the torch represent the Air Force core values. The flames represent all Force Support specialties coming together. The wolf symbolizes the commitment to serve others and the importance of working together in order to accomplish the mission. The motto "Simul nos sunt fortis" is Latin for "Together we are strong" and represents the knowledge that working together strengthens not just the people but the outcome of the mission.
