EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, an American bald eagle Proper, radiating from its talons to dexter three lightning flashes Or, in chief a representation of the Alamo Argent, all within a narrow border White. Attached above the disc, a Scarlet scroll edged with a narrow White border and inscribed "SEMPER PARATUS" in White letters. Attached below the disc, a Scarlet scroll edged with a narrow White border and inscribed "433D LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in White letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle is a national symbol and represents the unit's commitment to national defense. The lightning flashes symbolize the unit's quick response and worldwide capability to the assigned mission. The Alamo signifies the parent wing and its goals.
