EMBLEM



On a shield or bordered or, and American bald eagle volant (wings outspread), azure (sky blue), highlighted bluebird, his wings superimposed over the border, airlifting with his talons a sphere of a second (white), fimbriated (bordered), longitude, latitude lines, grappling iron attached to upper of the sphere, all of the forth (yellow). **SIGNIFICANCE**: The principal colors of our emblem, blue, golden yellow and white, relate to the Military Airlift Command and USAF emblem colors. The white and blue symbolize the sky and clouds, the theater where our airlift mission is performed. The American bald eagle, our National bird, carrying the globe with its talons, symbolically indicates our global airlift support. Of the noble virtues, blue symbolizes vigilance, perseverance, and justice; white, the heraldic representation of silver, is for purity; and yellow, the heraldic representation of gold, is for knowledge and enlightenment.
