OPERATIONS

The 437th Tanker Airlift Control Element (TALCE) returned to Charleston AFB from Griffiss AFB, New York on 10 Jan 1993, after a 34-day deployment (6 December 1992). The TALCE had been tasked to load a brigade of 10th Mountain Division infantry personnel and equipment for deployment to Mogadishi, Somalia, during Operation Restore Hope. The TALCE included 71 Charleston-based personnel and 44 personnel from other bases. The TALCE was under the command of Lt Col James A. Danielik, 437th Airlift Control Squadron (ALCS) commander. The element launched and recovered 112 C-141s, five C-5s, four KC-10s, four B-747s, and one DC-10. Aerial porters processed and loaded 3,973 Army troops, 223 Humvees, 50 five-ton trucks, 128 trailers, 205 pallets, eight forklifts, and four helicopters. The total weight exceeded 5 million pounds of cargo.
