EMBLEM



459 Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron emblem: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle perched on the gauntlet suggests the unit's primary mission of launch and recovery of aircraft and reflects the patriotic dedication of the Squadron personnel. The Capitol dome recalls the location of the unit. The chevrons on a green field signify the dual nature of the reservist (citizen-soldier) and the land-based service of the unit and its enlisted personnel. The three gold stars represent the pride,
