EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a stylized mountain range Gris, edged Argent, supported by a cloud bank of the same, surmounted overall by a bull enraged and charging Sable, detailed and unglued of the

second, horned and eyed of the third, with Red pupils and snorting clouds detailed of the same, all entoured by a gear wheel of eighteen cogs of the fourth, bearing an annulet Or, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MILLE PASSUM AGGER MUNITORIS" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "460TH CIVIL ENGINEER SQUADRON" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The charging bull represents the expeditionary nature of the unit's engineers, who charge forward all around the world providing endless engineering support. The mountains represent the highest marks of excellence required of unit personnel and the site of the Squadron's origin. The gear represents the constructed environment that meshes with others (weapon systems and trained personnel) to enable the Air Force to perform its function.
