EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, issuing from a demi-sphere in base Celeste, gridlined and between two polar orbits Or, a stylized dollar sign Vert, fimbriated of the like, overall three pole stars one in dexter, chief, and sinister Gules, shaded Tenné, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Green scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "EROGO SIDEREUS BELLATOR" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Green scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "460TH COMPTROLLER SQUADRON" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The earth represents the global nature of Air Force space operations. Encompassing the globe are two orbital paths representing the worldwide coverage provided in accomplishing the surveillance mission. The three pole stars represent the three Air Force core values of Integrity, Excellence and Service. They are centered around the dollar sign that represents the unit's mission of ever vigilance in protection of the public funds entrusted to it to complete the space mission. (Approved, 30 Oct 2006)
