### EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a stylized torch palewise Or, enflamed Gules, between an olive branch enbowed to dexter and a lightning bolt enbowed to sinister Yellow, all within a border compony Argent and Sable, within a narrow border of the last. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "482D SERVICES FLIGHT" in Black letters Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "NOT WITHOUT US" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The torch, a universal symbol for the service career, alludes to the unit's attributes of strength, vigilance, spirit and camaraderie. The olive branch is representative of peace, while the lightning bolt signifies combat strength and readiness. Thirty-six black and white squares represent each ten-degree variant of the compass -- a complete 360 degrees -- to reflect readiness to support worldwide missions.
