EMBLEM

The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. On a blue disc, a red

peace pipe and tomahawk garnished yellow crossed diagonally. Overall a yellow missile point up, all within a narrow yellow border. Attached below the disc a blank scroll bordered Yellow. Significance: The tomahawk, symbol of war, and the peace pipe, symbol of peace, represent the squadron's readiness capability while maintaining the goal of peace. The missile denotes the weapon system supported by the squadron. (Approved, 4 April 1985)
