#### **EMBLEM**

Per pale Azure and Vert a nebulée palewise Or, issuant at nombril a mullet couped Gules, surmounted by a second mullet Argent inner fimbriation of the first, all within a diminished bordure Or. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and

inscribed "502 ISG" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The divided shield represents the earth and the sky. The foundation of this emblem honors the heraldry of the unit. This emblem maintains roots from the first official emblem, approved in 1954, and serves as a reminder of the past. The lone star signifies a shining example of service to guide the way. The three visible points of the star represent Air Force, Army and Navy in joint ventures. The two interlocking points of the land and sky signify the strength and united effort of the joint forces serving within the 502d Air Base Wing. The colors formed by the border of the emerging star represent the United States and the forces assembled to protect the serenity of this country.
