OPERATIONS

Combat in ETO, 12 Apr 1944-9 May 1945. Provided air refueling for SAC's strategic fighter aircraft, Mar 1954-Jun 1957.

The 4060th Air Refueling Wing, Medium was organized at Dow Air Force Base on March 8, 1955, thus becoming the first Air Refueling Wing in the history of the United States Air Force. The Wing was first comprised of the 506th Air Refueling Squadron. This Squadron was equipped with the KB-29 and was combat ready in March of 1955.

Another unit assigned was the 71st Air Refueling Squadron. This Squadron was equipped with the KC-97G, the first of which arrived at Dow Air Force base on April 9, 1955. Other units included the 4060th Armament and Electronic Maintenance Squadron; the 4060th Periodic Maintenance Squadron; and the 4060th Field Maintenance Squadron; the 4060th Air Base Group; the 4033rd USAF Hospital; and the 33rd Crash Boat Rescue Flight at Southwest Harbor, Maine. Eventually all of the KB-29 were replaced by the KC-97. Another KC-97 unit, the 341st Air Refueling Squadron, replaced the 506th Air Refueling Squadron.
